Introduction

If *Star Wars* is an extraordinarily rich and detailed fantasy world, LEGO® *Star Wars*™ is that same fantasy world made entirely of colored bricks. In LEGO *Star Wars*, all the characters, vehicles, settings, and weapons of the movies are instantly recognizable, yet subtly different. The wealth of movie-accurate details surprise and delight even the most dedicated *Star Wars* fans: From the targeting sensors on the front of Emperor Palpatine's shuttle to the inclusion of Sullustan B-wing pilot Ten Numb. The LEGO Group's designers are endlessly creative with the lexicon of LEGO elements—a minifigure cup standing in for headlamps on an airspeeder or a green frog from a fairy-tale set becoming a gong in Jabba's snack bowl. (The only thing more enjoyable is encountering new elements made especially for a LEGO *Star Wars* set: For instance, the printed flap on the cockpit of the Mini AT-ST, which is incredibly simple yet depicts an armor plate, two viewports, and a forward sensor.) But the differences between the movie originals and the LEGO versions are as much fun to spot: A change of color scheme, a new feature, an interior designed for two minifigures rather than a legion of battle droids. Yes, LEGO *Star Wars* exists in both the *Star Wars* world and the LEGO world, and this is what makes it so fascinating to children and collectors alike.

TIMELINE

The LEGO Group released its first *Star Wars* sets in 1999 to coincide with the release of *Star Wars: Episode I The Phantom Menace*. Models were then issued for each new movie in the Prequel Trilogy (Episodes I to III), as well as sets based on the Classic Trilogy and the *Star Wars: The Clone Wars* animated TV show, along with a handful of vehicles from the Expanded Universe (video games, comics, novels, etc.).

DATA BOXES

Throughout the book, each LEGO *Star Wars* set is identified with a data box (see example below), which provides the official name of the set, the year it was first released, the LEGO identification number of the set, the number of LEGO pieces, or elements, in each set (excluding minifigures), and the movies in which the model appears: The abbreviations "EP I" to "EP VI" are used for each of the six movies (EP I, for instance, being *Star Wars: Episode I The Phantom Menace*); "CW" is the 2008 animated *Star Wars: The Clone Wars* movie (and ongoing TV show); and "EU" refers to the Expanded Universe.





Anakin Skywalker

Anakin's journey from a slave boy to perhaps the most capable and ambitious Jedi ever is filled with action and danger. Anakin has always been an incredible pilot and has flown everything from "borrowed" speeders to custom-designed Jedi starfighters during the Clone Wars. But Anakin's daring has its price: The loss of his hand in battle with Count Dooku starts a process of dehumanization that will end in the full body armor of Darth Vader.



Young Anakin Skywalker (with a yellow face) and his trusty astromech, R2-D2, fly the Naboo N-1 starfighter that blows up the Trade Federation's Droid Control Ship. The two blaster-wielding battle droids included with this set are unable to function without the signals from that Control Ship!

Young Anakin Skywalker, in Tatooine robes, now has a natural face color and short legs (which cannot move). He fits in the cockpit of the starfighter, entering via a boarding ladder. An alternative pilot, a Naboo pilot minifigure, also comes with the set. R2-D2 sits in the droid socket at the back, with a drop-release mechanism that enables him to exit in a hurry! The ship can blast its missile (situated on the underside) at the vulture droid starfighter, also included in the set.

Teenage Anakin is now a headstrong Padawan, training under Jedi Master Obi-Wan Kenobi. Anakin wears a Padawan braid (printed on his minifigure's shirt). He and Obi-Wan sit in this airspeeder with its exposed turbojets. The Jedi store their lightsabers in a secret compartment. Can the Jedi catch up with assassin Zam Wessel's speeder, as they weave through the skyscrapers of the city planet, Coruscant?

Anakin first meets his future wife, Padmé Naberrie, on Tatooine. At this time, she's Queen of Naboo, but is disguised as a simple peasant. This figure came with Mos Espa Podrace (set 7171).

Padawan

In Star Wars: Episode I The Phantom Menace, Obi-Wan is the Padawan of Jedi Master Qui-Gon Jinn. With a Padawan braid and yellow face, his minifigure battles droidikes two at a time. He wears his Jedi hood when he travels in a Gungan sub and, with a flesh-colored face, when he flies in the Republic Cruiser.


For a Jedi who's not crazy about flying, Obi-Wan Kenobi pilots a starfighter a lot of the time—though he can't help losing them, too! Kenobi trains headstrong Anakin Skywalker and goes on missions to far-flung planets including Utapau and Mustafar. Under the Empire, an exiled Obi-Wan meets Luke Skywalker and fights a final duel against his former Padawan, now named Darth Vader.

Jedi Starfighter

A yellow-faced Kenobi, Jedi Master to Anakin Skywalker; wears a headset when piloting his Delta-7 Aethersprite light interceptor. Kenobi's trusty astromech, R4-P17 (styled slightly differently from the movie), provides support. Together, they duel with Jango Fett's Slave I, blasting by the asteroids above Geonosis!

In exile on Tatooine, Obi-Wan becomes known as Ben Kenobi. His hair is gray and he wears a cream-colored Jedi robe. He appears in Luke's landspeeder and at the Mos Eisley cantina, as well as in the Millennium Falcon and Death Star (both Ultimate Collector sets).



Jedi Knights

For millennia, the Jedi were the guardians of peace and justice in the galaxy. During the Clone Wars, they become military leaders, fighting alongside clone troopers—in vain. The Sith emerge victorious and the Jedi ranks are decimated. The few remaining Jedi go into hiding until the time comes to restore balance to the Force.

BRICK FACTS

- Kit Fisto's head was the first LEGO® *Star Wars*™ minifigure not to be made from the resilient plastic ABS. Rubber holds more detail and is easier to cast.
- Luminara Unduli's minifigure first appeared as part of a limited-edition invitation to special guests for the launch of the *Revenge of the Sith* sets at the 2005 International Toy Fair in New York.

Republic Cruiser



A Jedi Master and member of the Jedi Council, Mace Windu is an awesome lightsaber fighter. When he rides in a Clone Turbo Tank, his minifigure wields a rare purple lightsaber, with a light-up blade. However, in the version of this set reissued in 2007, Mace uses a normal lightsaber.

Jedi Knight Kit Fisto is a Nautolan, an amphibious species whose head tentacles can sense others' feelings—an ability that can prove useful in combat. During the Clone Wars, Fisto became a member of the Jedi Temple. The head tentacles on his minifigure are made from rubber and he carries a green lightsaber.

The red Republic cruiser Radiant VII carries Qui-Gon Jinn and Obi-Wan Kenobi to their diplomatic mission on Naboo. The ship accommodates the Republic captain and pilot minifigures, with seats for the Jedi in the detachable salon pod. The ship has hidden blaster cannons, detachable landing gear, storage for guns and electrobinoculars, and a space speeder mini-vehicle. An R2-R7 droid provides inflight backup.



QUI-GON JINN

Jedi Qui-Gon Jinn was Padawan to Count Dooku and Master to Obi-Wan. His minifigure fights battle droids on STAPs in the Gungan swamp, combats Darth Maul on Tatooine, rides with Jar Jar and Obi-Wan in a Gungan sub, battles a red security battle droid, and flies with Obi-Wan in the Republic cruiser, Radiant VII.

Duel on Mustafar

Teetering on service platforms above the red-hot lava of Mustafar, Obi-Wan (wearing a hood, unlike in the movie) fights his former Padawan, Anakin Skywalker, now recruited to the Sith and renamed Darth Vader. They are moved on long rods and their lightsabers glow (though they cannot be removed from the minifigures' hands). Meanwhile the pillars could come crashing down at any time!

LUMINARA UNDULI

Jedi Master Luminara Unduli is a female Miralian, an exotic humanoid species whose facial tattoos indicate physical accomplishments. Master Unduli fights in the Clone Wars, notably on Kashyyyk, where her minifigure, equipped with a green light-up lightsaber, rides with Yoda on the Wookiee catamaran.



YODA

Grand Master Yoda helps train Dooku before the Count leaves the Jedi Order and joins the Sith. In exile on Dagobah, Yoda teaches Luke Skywalker. His minifigure defends itself against a speeder bike-riding Dooku on Geonosis, and accompanies fellow Jedi Luminara Unduli and Chewbacca on a Wookiee catamaran.



Darth Maul's minifigure yields a double-bladed lightsaber in Sith Infiltrator (set 7151) and Star Wars #1 (set 3340). In Lightsaber Duel (set 7101) and Sith Infiltrator (set 7663), his lightsaber is single-bladed.




Sith Apprentices

"Always two there are. A Master and an apprentice. No more, no less." Yoda explains that, for thousands of years, the secret Sith Order has controlled its numbers. It has also waited until the time was right to overturn the Jedi and seize control of the galaxy. Before Darth Vader stood at Darth Sidious's side, the Sith Lord's apprentices were Darth Maul and Count Dooku.

Darth Maul's Sith Infiltrator spaceship can disappear and reappear in space using a cloaking device contained in the nose. Maul rides his speeder bike (included with the set) through the hatch in the back and steers the ship with his bike controls. A hidden hatch in the top reveals storage for Maul's lightsaber, probe droids, and electrobinoculars.

Sith apprentice Darth Maul rides an open-cockpit speeder. Powered by a powerful repulsor engine, this super-fast vehicle is highly maneuverable, turning at high speed around obstacles such as the moisture vaporator that comes with the set. Darth Maul carries the single lightsaber that he uses to fight Qui-Gon Jinn on Tatooine. The bike and moisture vaporator can be recombined to create a repulsorlift laser-blaster platform.

Darth Maul returns in a sleeker version of his Sith Infiltrator, with flick-firing missiles and equipment storage in the nose (for probe droids, electrobinoculars, and a lightsaber hilt). Maul's speeder bike drives into the rear of the ship so Maul can operate the flight controls. Two of the ship's weapons can be removed to provide Maul with a double-bladed Sith lightsaber.

Two of the most legendary bounty hunters in the galaxy are Jango Fett and his son, Boba Fett.

Jango Fett's Slave I is bristling with weapons, many of which are hidden to deliver devastating surprise assaults. The armaments consist of two four-barrel fold-out blaster cannons, twin rotating laser cannons, two concealed heat-seeking rocket launchers, and three drop bombs, as well as a removable prisoner cage. A smuggling box can be magnetically attached to the underside of the ship. When the repulsorlift wings swivel, they rotate the cockpit from landing to flight mode.

Bounty hunter Jango Fett wears distinctive Mandalorian armor (Mandalorians were the best mercenaries in the galaxy) and carries custom-made WESTAR-34 blasters. Jango's regular face can swivel to a black face when wearing his helmet (though his hair must be removed!).







Separatist Army

Although mass armies are illegal at the start of the Clone Wars, many wealthy commercial bodies use private forces to enforce payments and collect debts. These armies are pooled to form the Separatist army, which begins to wage deadly war across the galaxy.

▼ Armored Assault Tank

Trade Federation battle tanks, called AATs (Armored Assault Tanks), are repulsorlift tanks carrying massive forward-facing guns. A pilot droid in the forward seat drives the tank into battle, with a second battle droid acting as gunner in the top hatch. AATs spearhead the invasion of Naboo, rolling into Theed to take the Palace and meeting the Gungan army on the grass plains.






▲ MTT (2000)

When the Trade Federation invades Naboo, it transports platoons of ground troops in huge MTTs (Multi Troop Transports, or, simply, large transports). This model can hold six battle droids, deployed via a sliding rack system from the hinged front hatch. Side doors open to reveal a storage compartment and a control room with a pilot seat. The back hatch opens to fire the forward blaster cannons.

BRICK FACTS

- The Trade Federation MTT (set 7662, released in 2007) was the first set to include battle droid minifigures with turned hands that could hold a standard blaster. The set also included a redesigned droidika.





Swarms of pilot-less droid fighters (or Vulture droid fighters) are unleashed against enemies. They are controlled by signals from a central Droid Control Ship computer. 
Guided buzz-droid missiles burst open in the vicinity of enemy ships to launch buzz droids armed with cutters and graspers, which they then use to attack the nearby craft. Buzz droids are small enough to slip through a target ship's shields and they carry schematics in their droid "brains" to identify a ship's weak points.

General Grievous

The Supreme Commander of the Droid Armies is a villainous cyborg called General Grievous. Grievous does not consider himself a droid, however—and reacts savagely to anyone who calls him one. His hatred of the Jedi Knights in particular is long-standing and all-consuming. His only pleasure is defeating Jedi in battle and collecting their lightsabers as trophies.

▲ Wheel Bike

On Utapau, General Grievous rides a wheel bike, designed to achieve intimidating high speeds across hard terrain. If obstacles block its path, no problem: Its two pairs of legs just walk over them! The set comes with Obi-Wan on a giant lizard—and a rare minifigure of Grievous with his cape.

Battle Droids

Battle droids are the foot soldiers of the Separatist Army. The advantage of these mindless mechanized soldiers is that they can be manufactured easily and cheaply in huge factories on planets such as Geonosis. Basic battle droids have no independent thought processors, although upgraded versions, such as commanders and super battle droids, are able to make limited independent tactical decisions.

Infantry Battle Droid

Infantry battle droids make up the majority of the Separatist land troops. Early versions of the minifigure have two identical hands. From 2007 onward, battle droid minifigures have a turned hand in order to hold a blaster properly.

Droid Commander

Commanders operate with a degree of autonomy compared to the standard infantry. They come in two versions, one with a partially yellow chest and the other with a completely yellow chest.



Security Droid

This model of battle droid specializes in basic security tasks, including patrols and guarding prisoners. They are denoted by the dark-red coloring on their chests.

Pilot Droid

Blue chest coloration identifies pilot droids. These specialist droids control various vehicles, including MTTs and battle droid carriers.

► Super Battle Droid

Super battle droids are larger, stronger versions of regular battle droids. They are equipped with tougher armor. A metal-blue version came with the Republic Gunship (set 7163, from 2002). A dark-gray version came with the Droids Battle Pack (set 7654, from 2007) and the Halifire Droid & Spider Droid (set 7670, from 2008).






Blasters fire bursts of particle-beam energy from power cells. Standard types are internally modified for use by different soldiers (battle droids, clone troopers, stormtroopers, Rebel troops, etc.). Ion weapons fire ion energy instead of blaster bolts.

Destroyer droids, or droidekas, roll into battle, uncurl, encase themselves in a semi-transparent energy shield, and then deploy built-in blasters to deadly effect. 

▼ Gunship

The Republic gunship, or Low-Altitude Assault Transport/infantry (LAAT/i), deploys clone soldiers into battle. Troops dismount through sliding doors, under cover of swiveling laser cannons (two on the front and one at the back) and four laser turrets (two manned and two remote). The nose opens to reveal a magnetically held, detachable prison cell.



Republic Army

For generations, the Republic had no army, relying only on the Jedi Knights to maintain peace and justice in the galaxy. But the vast Separatist Droid Army forced Republic leaders to take decisive action. The Galactic Republic quickly amassed one of the largest armies ever seen. Its ranks are made up of clone troopers and its ground and air vehicles are diverse and specialized.

▼ AT-TE Walker

The six-legged All Terrain Tactical Enforcer, or AT-TE walker, blasts ground or air targets with its massive cannon, while its six laser cannon turrets focus on smaller targets. This modified AT-TE carries four clones and, in the rear compartment, a speeder bike.






Clone Troopers

At the start of the Clone Wars, clone troopers wear Phase I armor, which is loosely based on Jango Fett's Mandalorian shock trooper armor. Informally called "the body bucket," this armor is heavy and often uncomfortable. Colored stripes denote rank. During the later part of the Clone Wars, Phase II armor mainly replaces Phase I armor. Phase II armor is stronger, lighter, and more adaptable than the earlier type, with many specialist variations. Color now denotes unit affiliation, not rank.




Phase II Trooper

Episode III sets were issued with clone troopers wearing Phase II armor. Their helmets feature improved breath filter/annunciators and their heads are plain black under the helmets. Camouflage is sometimes used on Phase II armor.



Clone pilots are trained to fly hyperdrive-capable ships including ARC-170s and V-wing starfighters. These clones wear air-supply helmets, white armor, and blue flightsuits.



STAR CORPS TROOPER

Star Corps clone troopers, attached to the 327th Star Corps, are an elite force with yellow armor markings. One appears with the Clone Turbo Tank (set 7261) and the Clone Troopers Battle Pack (set 7655).


- A slightly adapted Phase I clone trooper appears with *Star Wars: The Clone Wars* (animated TV series) sets.
- Specialist ARC troopers receive a helmet-mounted rangefinder, a visor, a floodlight, a kama (a flexible, anti-blast skirt), a command pauldron, and two small DC-17 commando blasters.





CLONE RECON TROOPER

Clone recon troopers, with red armor markings, are specialized clones that carry out short-range reconnaissance missions for Jedi Generals and clone commanders. They often utilize BARC speeders, AT-AP walkers, and AT-RT walkers.



Aerial Trooper

These specialized clones wear rocket-powered wings for aerial operations. An aerial trooper was part of the contingent attached to the Clone Turbo Tank (set 7261).



Clone scout troopers are equipped with green armor for camouflage on jungle worlds. Their visors are adapted for greater visibility. A scout trooper works alongside the troops on the Clone Turbo Tank set.

Red-colored shock troopers form an elite corp, stationed on Coruscant, that reports directly to Supreme Chancellor Palpatine. Two versions have been released: One has all-white legs and the other has white legs with black in the middle. Shock troopers come with the AT-AP Walker (set 7671) and the Clone Troopers Battle Pack (set 7655).



Wookiees

During the Clone Wars, an epic battle takes place on Kashyyyk, home planet of the Wookiees. Droid armies face fierce resistance from well-armed and proud Wookiee warriors, led by commander Tarfful and including Chewbacca. Wookiees use traditional wood-framed vehicles, many of which are unarmed, but the Wookiees' knowledge of the swamps and forests of their planet gives them an advantage over the ruthless droids.



Ornithopter

Wookiee ornithopters, also known as fluttercraft, are lightweight, two-seated fliers used to patrol the swamps of Kashyyyk. During the Battle of Kashyyyk, Wookiee pilots and gunners fly these open-cockpit craft, many retrofitted with tail-mounted laser cannons, relying on speed and agility to avoid incoming fire.






The other droids in the sandcrawler are A GNK power droid, a Treadwell repair droid, R1-C4, an R1-series astromech refitted with the armored shell of a Mark II reactor drone; an ASP (general labor) droid; and a faulty astromech, R5-D4.

Sandcrawler

On Tatooine, Jawa sandcrawlers patrol the deserts and wastelands in search of salvage from spaceship crashes. Sandcrawlers are forgotten relics from the days when Tatooine was a mining colony. Jaws have repurposed them to round up stray droids, junked vehicles, and any unwanted scrap metal or minerals that can be used or sold. Each sandcrawler is home to an entire clan of Jaws, and serves as transport, workshop, traveling store—and safe protection from desert predators or rampaging Sand People.

Transfer Crane

A transfer crane picks up scrap droids and transports them into the bowels of the sandcrawler, where they are either mended or broken up for spare parts. The crane can attach to the sandcrawler roof.





Han and its previous captains have tinkered with its systems over the years, adding Imperial-military-grade armor, quad laser cannons, an outsized sensor dish, and many other customized features—all of which require frequent repairs!


▼ Engines

At sublight speed, the Falcon relies on two heavily modified Girodyne SRB42 engines that emit glowing blue exhaust gases when fired up. Sublight drives propel spaceships within star systems or far enough away from planets so they can safely jump to hyperspace.





▼ Imperial Shuttle

The *Lambda*-class shuttle is a multi-purpose transport vessel used throughout the Imperial fleet. These unusually elegant vessels also carry the Imperial elite, including Emperor Palpatine and Darth Vader. It is an ominous sight when the yellow-faced Palpatine minifigure, grasping his superfluous cane and flanked by red-robed Imperial guards, appears from the shuttle, piloted by an Imperial shuttle pilot.




Emperor Palpatine

Feared Sith Lord Emperor Palpatine rules as dictator over the most oppressive regime the galaxy has ever known. Rarely seen, even by his own officers, the Emperor wears a black hood over a face that has been deformed by dark side energies. Never content with the extent of his rule, Emperor Palpatine's focus now is on replacing his apprentice, Darth Vader, with Vader's own son, the powerful Jedi Luke Skywalker.

► Emperor Palpatine

Emperor Palpatine's face is distorted by Dark Side energies and his sulphurous eyes betray his inner anger. Palpatine wears a black robe to hide his face and often walks with a cane, not because he needs it, but because he wishes to pretend that he is weak.





Sidious renames Anakin as Darth Vader, whose first mission is to destroy the Jedi Order. Only a few Jedi escape the "Great Jedi Purge." Vader soon becomes a feared leader of the Empire.

An AT-AT's side opens to reveal a staging platform for the two snowtrooper minifigures and its rear opens to deploy a speeder bike. An AT-AT driver steers the walker from a cockpit in its head.



► Stormtrooper



Nameless, faceless stormtroopers are utterly loyal to the Empire. Minifigures appear either with or without mouth grilles ('clotted mouths'), and with black, flesh-colored, or yellow heads under their helmets. Stormtroopers with Imperial Inspection (set 7264) have armor skin plates.

AT-ATs carry high-speed repulsorlift speeder bikes for antipersonnel or reconnaissance missions. They are deployed from a garage in the rear of the AT-AT body.



Imperial Navy

When Palpatine establishes his tyrannical Empire, the Republic's massive navy is appropriated and put to brutal use. Jedi-piloted Interceptor starfighters, with their solar-panel wings, are reborn as aggressive TIE fighters. Indeed, the Imperial fleet is expanded with a variety of new, ever-deadlier models, while Emperor Palpatine travels in an updated version of the shuttle he used as Supreme Chancellor.







Star Destroyer

Dagger-shaped Star Destroyers are the most feared symbol of Imperial might, armed with deadly firepower and powerful scanner and tractor-beam arrays. 


Cloud City

After the Battle of Hoth, Han Solo and Chewbacca escape with Leia and C-3PO to a floating pleasure resort and mining colony called Cloud City, located near a gas planet called Bespin. Its administrator, Lando Calrissian, is Han Solo's longtime friend and sometime rival. The arrival of Solo and the others, however, is preceded by Boba Fett and Darth Vader, who spring a trap and lure Luke Skywalker to a confrontation with Vader himself!

Duel with Vader

When Luke arrives at Cloud City to rescue his friends, Vader is waiting for him in the carbon freezing chamber. They ignite their lightsabers and duel through the chamber into a control room overlooking a huge reactor shaft. Luke is sucked through a smashed window and their final clash takes place on a treacherous gantry.


During the Clone Wars, the Jedi must forego their traditional role as peacemakers and take on military roles. Many become generals in the republic army, fighting alongside clone commanders and clone troops on numerous battlefronts.

In 2000, the LEGO Group released the first Technic Star Wars models, with a pit droid, battle droid, and destroyer droid (or droideka). Since then, new Technic sets have appeared for each Prequel Trilogy movie, as well as the Classic Trilogy movies.

The Imperial AT-ST, or chicken walker, stands over 42 cm (16.5 inches) tall and is constructed from LEGO bricks and Technic elements. The cockpit interior features no details, although the model has rotating weapons, an opening pilot hatch, and moving window panels.





Designing LEGO® Star Wars™



Jens Kronvold Frederiksen is Design Manager of the LEGO® Star Wars™ team in Billund, Denmark. He has worked at the LEGO Group for 11 years, 10 of them in the LEGO Star Wars team.

He personally created the stunning *Ultimate Collector Millennium Falcon*, as well as many other models. DK interviewed Jens to find out the secrets of how LEGO Star Wars is designed.

How big is the Star Wars team?

The Star Wars team consists of between four and seven designers. We also have project leaders, a marketing leader, engineers developing new elements, and building-instruction developers; we all sit in one big group.

Could you explain a little bit about your creative process?

First, we come up with suggestions for models for the various price points. These are presented to the LEGO Group and to the various markets. Lucas Licensing (LFL) also approves the assortment; there might be a vehicle that they recommend because it's in the new *Star Wars: The Clone Wars* TV series.

Then do you start sketching or drawing, or do you build with LEGO bricks?

That is very much up to the designer, because they all work differently. Some designers work best by doing sketches on paper or computer, and some just start building. Normally, I make a brief for the designer. For example, this model should have at least four minifigures—sometimes I know exactly which minifigures and sometimes it's open. I might have some

ideas about the model's functions, but also the designers come up with special features or functions. We then have the "sketch model" calculated to see if it fits the specific price point. For a very rough idea, we sometimes put the model on a scale and weigh it, as this is actually a pretty good indicator.

Do you have a lot of LEGO bricks, or elements, in your studio?

Yes, we have element drawers behind where we sit, containing all of the elements that are in stock at that time.

How do you decide when to create an entirely new element for a set?

That is something I would put on the design brief. As you also know, many of our new elements are minifigures, so that's very easy to decide beforehand. But sometimes we also know from the beginning whether to construct a specific model with something new. Or a designer will talk to me and say, "I can not make this model without this new wingtip" or whatever.

Do you often need to amend, change or simplify a sketch model?

It depends. Sometimes if a sketch model is very, very good, it would be a pity to remove some cool functions. We discuss whether we should move the model to a higher price point. But in many cases, the designer simplifies the model or scales it down. Sometimes we even make the models too inexpensively, so we then add extra functions or figures and so on. But now, with the experience that we have got, it's normally pretty close.

How long does it take to design a sketch model?

That depends on the size of the model. A mini model can take an afternoon, but can also take a week. A big model like the *Tantive IV* can take a couple of months. Sometimes we make models that we don't use straight away, but we still keep everything.

What is the next stage in the design process?

We have something called Model Review. This is a process in which very skilled or experienced designers from outside the Star Wars team work with our designer, engineers, building-instruction developers, and everyone involved in the model. Together, they ensure that the model can be shown in the building instructions in an understandable way. We also test the technical quality—to ensure the model does not fall apart and that there are no elements that are stretched and then could break.

We also normally heat test the models! Because if you take a LEGO model and display it in your window, in the sun, it will get to pretty high temperatures. Plastic is a funny material as it actually expands in the heat, which means the bricks will be a little bit more loose. Therefore, we take the


model and put in an oven at 60 degrees Celsius for about four hours, which is the same stress as if a model were standing for about a year in a window.

The big Ultimate Collectors Millennium Falcon was too big for the oven! So we called a local swimming pool that had a sauna and we brought the model in and put it there for some hours, and it worked!

When all the internal quality issues are okay, I send lots of pictures of the model with a long description to LFL. Sometimes we make small movie clips to show functions. Occasionally, we also send them physical models—it depends on how complex the model is. But normally it's just pictures.

And then LFL evaluates it from a Star Wars point of view?

They evaluate it by comparing it to their official reference, which we also use. They are very particular about the outside but are normally quite open about the inside. Like us, LFL is very aware that the models are actually toys and do have to be fun, so sometimes we will put something in the interior that is not actually in the movies, just because it is fun.

Did this particular model take a lot longer than normal to design?

It is hard to say because I actually started it outside of work, just for fun. I was aware that a real Millennium Falcon should fit four minifigures in the cockpit. None of the previous play model versions had a big enough cockpit. When I was halfway through the process, the LEGO shop came by and saw it and decided it would be interesting to sell it at a higher price point. Then I was given the most amazing brief: They let me make the model the way I wanted it first and they priced it afterward!

Are you all Star Wars fans?

Well, not everyone, but the designers are normally big fans. If they weren't, they would not be able to come up with and create the best products for the brand. They know all these small details, so it is definitely an interest.

Do you regularly test models by asking children to play with them?

Yes. We ask in a group of children from the correct age group and just let them play with the sketch models. We observe the kids playing without interfering. It's quite easy to spot a model that no one is playing with. We can also see if a model breaks apart too easily or is too hard to make. You always have to have the kids in mind. With the Ultimate Collectors Series, it's about having something nice to display, but with the minifigure-based models, they just have to be good toys.

Finally, would you tell me something about the exclusive Luke Skywalker minifigure that comes with this book?

One of our graphic designers, Chris Bonven Johansen, designed the minifigure after LFL suggested adding an exclusive one to the book. We had a brainstorming session in the team and proposed Luke because this book is a celebration, and the minifigure comes from the celebration scene in Star Wars: Episode IV A New Hope, so it couldn't fit better. I am also sure that this minifigure will never appear with any other product, so it's a great choice!



A 1:1 scale prototype of the 2009 Hoth Rebel soldier's helmet. It is hand-sculpted in modeling clay, which is then baked in an oven to harden it. The prototype is digitally scanned and the resulting image used to make the actual mold for the production of the final plastic elements.

Can you give an example?

The Gungan Sub, for example. That model could actually be taken apart and used as three separate vehicles, which it obviously couldn't do in the movie. Also, in the new Mon Cal Cruiser, Admiral Ackbar has a coffee mug beside him on the railing!

Which models were most challenging to design?

Many different things can be challenging—it could be the building instructions or it could be the stability of the model. From the models I have designed myself, such as the UCS Millennium Falcon, getting the stability right was the hardest thing. The exterior of this particular model was pretty close to the first sketch model. The big problem was the inside skeleton, which had to be reconstructed a couple of times to make it strong enough.




